Order

- 1. Respondent, his agents and employees, successors and assigns, directly or through any corporate or other device, shall cease and desist from violating the Act and the regulations and standards issued thereunder.
- 2. Respondent is assessed a civil penalty of \$4,000, which shall be paid by a certified check or money order made payable to "TREASURER OF THE UNITED STATES." Said check or money order shall include the docket number of this proceeding: AWA 95-69 and be mailed to:
